- **Managing air quality:** The air quality within each of our hospitals makes them the safest places to be in our region as we have high-quality HVAC systems, air scrubbers and other such strategies to ensure the safety and comfort of our caregivers, providers, patients and visitors. **Please note that odor does not mean the air quality**

is poor. If you are experiencing any issues relating to the current air quality conditions, please contact Employee Health via email at employeehealth@peacehealth.org, which is staffed by registered nurses seven days a week. The team can answer calls/return messages Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Eugene, Springfield, Cottage Grove: 541-222-2535; Florence: 541-902-6058). Attached to this email, you will also find a tip sheet to help you find ways to mitigate the issues related to air quality. Clean Air Centers

Appropriate safety precautions, including physical distancing and sanitation, will be taken to keep patrons and staff safe. No showers, food or supplies are available at the Clean Air Day Centers but charging of electronic devices will be available. Willamalane Temporary Smoke and Fire Shelters

Additionally, Willamalane has opened the following temporary rescue shelters for community members who have been evacuated or lost power.

- Bob Keefer Center, 250 S. 32nd St., Springfield
- Willamalane Adult Activity Center, 215 W. C St., Springfield

These sites will have capacity limits, adhere to social distancing requirements and include other regular sanitation protocols as required with current health guidelines. Willamalane can't offer showers right now, but that status may change as the situation progresses. Willamalane won't be charging any fees for people to use its facilities for temporary shelter. The Bob Keefer Center parking lot is allowing RV parking. There are limited spaces available.

DONATE GOODS:

Donations can be delivered to 2699 Roosevelt Boulevard in Eugene between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. each day. St. Vincent de Paul will work alongside community volunteers to manage the donation location. General donations should not be delivered to the Lane Events Center.

DONATE BLOOD:

While the need for blood donors is critical right now, we are experiencing a drop in those who are donating. Since Bloodworks Northwest provides the blood to 100% of Lane County hospitals, they need your help in communicating the urgency of this situation. Wildfire Smoke and Poor Air Quality: Tip Sheet

Wildfires can make the air unhealthy to breathe. Be aware that smoke can also enter your home and make it unhealthy to breathe indoor air too. Here are some tips to reduce your exposure to wildfire smoke and steps to manage your health.

Stay indoors. Limit your time outdoors and do not engage in strenuous activity outdoors.

If you must leave your home:

☑ Reduce smoke in your vehicle by closing vents and running the air conditioner in recirculate mode.

☑ Do not rely on dust masks or bandanas for protection. Fitted N95s may provide protection.

Keep smoke from entering your home

☑ Keep windows and doors closed.

☑ If you have an HVAC system, set the system to recirculate mode or close the outdoor intake damper.

☑ Use a portable air cleaner or high-efficiency filter to remove fine particles from the air.

☑ Avoid indoor activities that create more fine particles indoors, including frying or broiling food, burning candles or incense and vacuuming, unless your vacuum has a HEPA filter.

Healthy habits that can help

☑ Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water.

☑ Protect your eyes. Use eye drops and do not rub your eyes. Be sure to wash your hands before handling contact lenses.

☑ Pay attention to any health symptoms if you have asthma, COPD, heart disease or are pregnant. Get medical help if you need it.

☑ Continue to practice COVID-19 precautions, such as masking and maintaining social distancing.

- **Structural Assessment**

- A call center has been established to allow those impacted by the fires to receive information about their residences. Homeowners and residents can now call 541-682-3977 between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. to receive their assessment information.

- **Multi-Agency Resource Center**

- For residents and homeowners who would prefer to learn the status of their home assessment in person, beginning Wednesday Sept. 16, a Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) will be available for those affected.
- The Resource Center will include representatives from utility companies, Lane County Elections, insurance companies, housing support agencies, Senior and Disabled Services, Environmental Health, Lane County Assessment and Taxation, waste and debris disposal

coordinators, permit and land management staff, faith-based services and support, as well as mental health and medical support.

- MARC also will be available to those who have learned the status of their home or residence over the telephone and would like more information about those resources.
- **MARC will be open on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday this week from noon to 7 p.m. at the Lane Events Center, 796 West 13th, Eugene** and is not a donation drop-off or pick-up location and is only open to those people whose homes and properties are in the fire area.
